## Basics of Catholicism part 43

## Advent part 2

The Season of Advent has two poles. The first pole was discussed in the previous part: preparing for Jesus' first coming through prophesy and his second coming at the end of time. Often we misunderstand the focus of this first part of Advent as focused on the prophesies of the Old Testament. Since we spend the entire season reading from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah, it feels as through we are focusing on the prophesies as a way to prepare for Christmas. This idea is true but not complete. We are focusing on the prophesies for the sake of knowing that Jesus is the true Messiah and the one who will come again. By reading these prophesies we are reminded that he will come again as judge at the end of time.

## The 2nd part of Advent

Always starting on December 17<sup>th</sup>, we begin the second part of the Advent season. The second part of Advent is a sharp contrast to the previous part of Advent. The readings drastically change during this week. The first readings come from other prophesies from throughout the rest of Scripture that predict and explain the Messiah. The Gospel passage is one of the Infancy Narratives so that we begin preparing our minds for Christmas. Over the eight days between December 17<sup>th</sup> and Christmas, we will read the events of Jesus' early life leading up to his birth on Christmas.

The most foundational part of the second part of Advent are the O Antiphons. Most people don't realize their importance or that they form an integral part of this part of Advent. They occur in only two places of the liturgy. The first place is Gospel Acclamation during Mass. This phrase is usually sung in anticipation of the Gospel and therefore is easily overlooked in the context of the Mass. The second place these antiphons are used are for the antiphon for the Gospel Canticle in Evening Prayer. The seven O Antiphons are the titles and prophesies directly connected with the Messiah. The antiphons are the following: O Emmanuel, O King of Nations, O Root of Jesse, O Wisdom of God, O Leader of House of David, O Key of David, and O Radiant Dawn.

One final note about Advent. Advent and Lent are the only two seasons in which the liturgical color of rose is used. The 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Advent has the optional color of rose to represent the joy of the mid-point of the Season. This Sunday is called Gaudete Sunday since on this Sunday we read about the coming of the Messiah for the first time in the Season of Advent.

The Season of Advent concludes at the evening of December  $24^{th}$  with the start of the Christmas Season.
