Basics of Catholicism part 74 Conditions for a mortal sin

A sin is considered a mortal or grave sin if the following three conditions are met.

- The sin is of grave matter. Not all sins are grave matter for instance forgetting to pray for a day is considered a sin and dishonors God but is not serious. The classification of a grave or serious sin can be tricky. The most common tool used to understand grave sins is the 10 Commandments. These 10 Commandments summarize the nature of truly serious matter. A sin of grave matter deeply harms our relationship with God and those around us. The most common examples of mortal sins include intentionally missing Mass on Sundays and Holy Days, using the Lord's name in vain, dishonoring the sabbath, adultery, fornication, pornography, theft, murder, envy, jealousy, pride, gluttony, revenge, vengeance, desecration of the Sacraments, apostacy, schism, and more.
- The person must understand that the sin is mortal. God is immensely merciful and realizes the extent of our knowledge and abilities. Often people, for a variety of reasons, do not realize that a particular action is wrong. For instance if I grew up in a gang neighborhood, I might believe that violence is the way to solve disputes including murder. The Church teaches that the responsibility of every person is to inform their conscience so that they know what is right and wrong. The ability to discern well a good from an evil action is a necessary part of living well. Therefore, there are two parts to this condition. First, we must know which sins are mortal and of serious matter. We also are required to avoid them and strive for a life of virtue. The more we know about the gravity of a sin, the more we are held accountable to its effects and can be punished. Second, often people are misinformed about the gravity of sins. The most commonly misunderstood mortal sin is missing Mass on Sunday. We are held accountable to the extent we understood the gravity of our actions but the sin is still grave matter regardless of our understanding or knowledge of its consequences.
- We must have full consent of the will. This last condition is tricky. The basic idea is that we freely choose to do the action that is sinful. Some argue that we are never truly free when making decisions. Such conditions like habits, addictions, feelings, the condition of the world hinder our ability to choose. Although some of this is true. I argue that we have far more consent when we make decisions than we often realize. Even a person who habitually commits the sin may be given a moment of grace or worked to put blocks against that sin yet still fought against that grace and those block to commit the sin. This is an example of full consent of the will. We sell ourselves short on the incredible gift of our free will and the power that God has given us. We have far more strength in fighting against sin and temptation so that we can make good choices that we realize. Some conditions do reduce the gravity of the sin and should be mentioned. These include habits, additions, external factors forcing our decisions, and coercion. The quality of the sin as grave does not change instead we are less culpable for the sin because our free will is hindered. I encourage you to ponder the gift of free will and your ability to exercise it in decision making. Knowing the power of our free will gives us incredible strength in choosing and knowing the good.


