Basics of Catholicism part 47

The Sacraments

What is a Sacrament?

Sacraments are concrete realities that when you bump into them you bump into God. This definition was given to me by one of my professors from seminary. It contains the core elements of a Sacrament. The first part of understanding the Sacraments is that they teach us about God. Each Sacrament is a visible expression of the life, death, and Resurrection of Jesus. As we explore the Sacraments in detail throughout this series, the goal is to find the way that each Sacrament expresses God's will and the core elements of Jesus' ministry. Additionally, the Sacraments are about God. According to the Catechism, they are "visible signs of invisible grace." Each Sacrament shows the invisible grace of God in the visible forms of the Sacraments. They Sacraments themselves are not the grace. God gives his grace through the Sacraments.

The second part of the Sacraments is that they are visible signs or concrete realities. Each Sacrament has visible expressions of God's grace and tangible things that help us relate to God's grace and experience its effects. Not only do we need to watch for the signs of God's action in each Sacrament but now we must also look for the visible signs that help us understand the graces God wants to give us. Another way of expressing the concrete reality of the Sacraments is to realize that they function in our world. They are not some spiritual reality that we experience in signs. The physical signs of the Sacraments such as water and oil are part of the Sacrament and avenues of graces. Without these physical signs, the Sacraments do not happen.

We believe in 7 Sacraments: Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist, Anointing of the Sick, Penance/ Reconciliation, Holy Orders, and Marriage. These seven Sacraments have existed in the Church since Jesus inaugurated them during his life and ministry. In addition to the Sacraments are sacramentals. Sacramentals are things that draw us more deeply into the Sacraments. Usually these are things we used in the celebration of the Sacraments like Holy Water, Holy Oils, and blessed objects.

Each Sacrament is comprised on two major parts. The first part is the Liturgy of the Word. Similar to the Mass, each Sacrament begins with an introduction, then proclamation of the Word of God. Sometimes this part is a reading from a small part of Scripture. Other times the Liturgy of the Word can encompass three readings like at Mass. The second part of a Sacrament is the ritual or rite. This rite must be followed for a valid Sacrament. The rite encompasses the action of the Sacrament; what we do for to receive God's grace. For instance, baptism would be the action of baptizing the person. The Anointing of the Sick is the anointing of the person with oil. The rite also include the words, the explanation, and the action.




